



When a Parent is Away: Helping Children Write Letters

Writing letters is a great way to maintain the relationship between the child and parent. It costs less money than phone calls and video visits. It is also something children can do any time they are thinking of their parent and feel like connecting.



Why write letters?

- → It builds your **relationship** between the child and parent.
- → A letter is a gift. It is something the parent can hold and look at when they miss their child.
- → Letters **teach** children. Young children learn skills that get them ready to read. Older children practice and strengthen their reading and writing skills.

When helping your child write a letter

→ Talk about what your child wants to tell their loved one. For non-talkers, tell your child what you imagine they might say. For help with ideas, see "Sentence Starters"

- → If you are writing for your child, say the words out loud as you write.
- → Allow your child to draw a picture. Even scribbles are great children are developing their finger & hand muscles.
- → Plan to send cards or letters for holidays and special occasions.

When your child receives a letter

- → For young children, show them their name on the letter. Point out that their name begins with the letter ____. When your child recognizes the first letter, begin pointing out other letters in their name. As you read the letter together, point to the words.
- → For children who can read, stay close to support them. Receiving a letter from their parent may bring up strong feelings.
